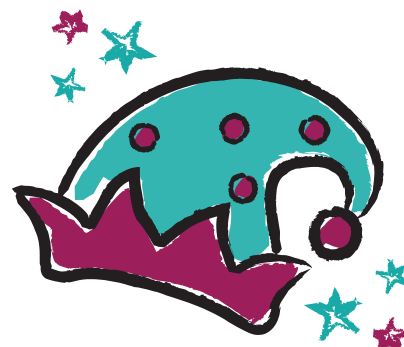


ELVES Schools' Challenge - EYFS
