A good newspaper article has:

- A short, snappy headline
- A summary of what the story is about in the first few sentences
- Is written in the third person and the past tense
- Is split into short paragraphs that are easier to read
- Includes quotes in speech marks
- Has images and photos with pictures captions
- Includes facts and information that give the reader all of the information
